
Hope Lutheran Church

People: Here is our water of life! Alleluia!




⁹The LORD will judge the world with righteousness and the peoples with equity.

And his commandments are not burdensome, ⁴for whatever is born of God conquers the world. 

People: Praise to you, O Christ.



People: hear our prayer.


Pastor: Into your hands, most merciful God, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your abiding love; through Jesus Christ, our resurrected and living Lord.


