Epiphany is about Jesus, what Jesus is revealing about Himself. In the season of Epiphany, we acknowledge Jesus' glory, Jesus' identity. We see Jesus' light for all people everywhere.

In this new year of 2025, the church has eight Sundays after Epiphany including Transfiguration Sunday to learn more about Jesus who changes our lives. (The number of Sundays after Epiphany depends on the date of Easter and, therefore, of Ash Wednesday.)

On Epiphany, the wise people are drawn from the east to come and honor Jesus with gifts. Everyone is welcome to come and honor Jesus. Just as the

magi showed up with gold, frankincense, and myrrh, so we can bring our gifts and talents to further the brightness of God's light for us and for all. Whatever we bring, is accepted, and contributes to God's purposes.

The Bible readings of this Epiphany season take us from wise people from the east to a dove from heaven and the voice of God, and then the miracle of water into wine—all pointing to the glory and wonder of God-made-flesh. Forty days after the birth of Christ, we will mark the day Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the temple. There a prophetess named Anna celebrated the gift of redemption that Jesus would bring. Simeon, an elderly prophet also greeted Mary and Joseph with a song describing Jesus as a "light for the nations."

Jesus is the light for all the world. And in the history of the church, Presentation of our Lord Sunday was also known as Candlemas, a day when all the candles to be used in the church were blessed for the coming year. In honor of Jesus' light in the world and in our lives, we will bless our candles. So, I invite you to bring a special candle from home and we will bless them together during worship on February 2. As we bless the candles, we will remember Jesus' presence is with us.

In this season of Epiphany, let us give thanks that Jesus is the light of the world. Let us rise and shine. Let us bear witness to God's light in a weary world.

Coats donated to help families in the St. Charles area stay warm through the ministry of Oasis Food Pantry. Thank you!


